'Dr Mercier's instrument: The problem of pathological knowledge in the asylum' c 1880-1905

In 1893, partly in response to allegations of mistreatment within British asylums, Dr Charles Mercier devised an instrument with which to measure ?the breaking strain of ribs? at post mortem. While the notion of asylum patients having peculiarly fragile bones was not entirely novel at this time, Mercier?s desire to investigate the issue in this way was noteworthy. He distributed the instrument to a number of British asylums and hospitals, including the West Riding Asylum where pathological research had been regularly pursued for some years.

By the early twentieth century, however? just ten years after Mercier?s device appeared? the details the instrument provided (such as ?convex? and ?concave? breaking strain) ceased to be recorded at post mortem. This paper examines the experiments undertaken at the West Riding using Mercier?s apparatus in order to address wider issues surrounding pathological research within the asylum: the dialogue between asylum pathologists, the desire to quantify bodily fabric, and the utility of post mortem research more widely.
