Directions from University Station (step-free):

- NB: The station was refurbished and re-opened in January 2024. There are now two exits. •
- Make your way to the pedestrian ramp on the ground floor on the 'Platform 2' side of the station.
- Taking the pedestrian ramp leads onto Westgate; travel along Westgate towards the University Centre. .
- Turn right onto Ring Road South until the intersection with University Road West, then turn left and continue across campus - passing under the Staff House walkway, across University Square, and down University Road East, where you will pass the Barber Institute of Fine Arts on your left.
- Continue until you come to the pedestrian crossing in front of the King Edward VI Foundation office. Crossing at the lights in front of the Foundation office, turn right, and continue down the hill towards the Bristol Road. The entrance to Edgbaston Park is 80m before the Bristol Road on the left-hand side; opposite the Sports Centre. .

- When entering Edgbaston Park from this side, Elm House is visible as you enter in the back left corner.
- NB: Please be mindful of cars in Edgbaston Park; you may need to cross the road to get to where you are going via . pavements.

Directions from Birmingham International Airport:

- Using the 'Air-Rail Link' free monorail shuttle, travel between the airport and Birmingham International Train Station.
- From Birmingham International Train Station, travel to Birmingham New Street Station, the next stop.
- Transfer to a local train, to University Station (two stops); typically a train to Redditch, Longbridge or Bromsgrove, from . platform 16.
- Once at University Station, follow the directions above. .
